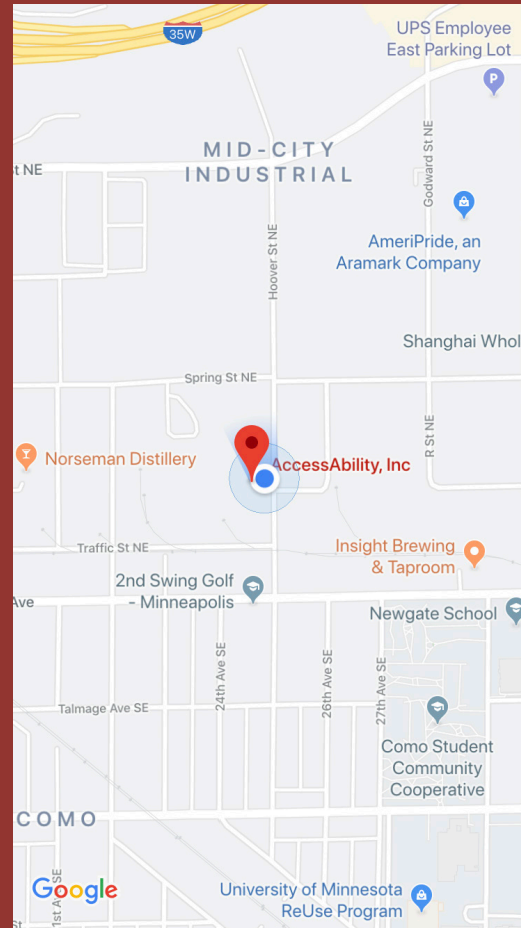

Vocational

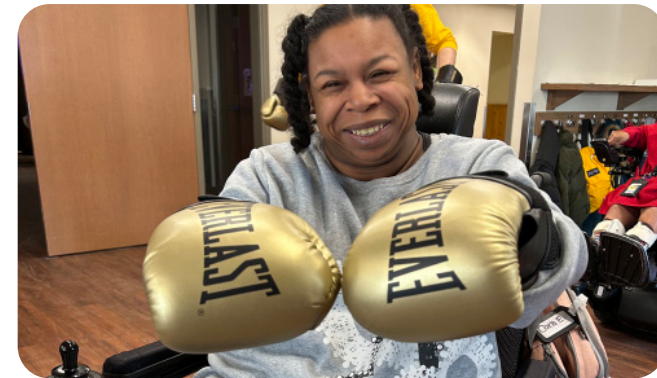
On-site subcontract employment opportunities to earn an income. Work skills training are provided. Jobs are in assembly, packaging, and mailing.

Community-Based Work Teams

Off-site employment roles at a variety of Twin Cities businesses while still offering training opportunities and support services.

Employment Services

Additional assistance in finding an independent community job that matches a person's skills and interests. This includes employment exploration, development, and support.



Day Support Services

Designed to enhance participants' skills and abilities through classes, recreational, and leisure activities. Community inclusion, social activities, and life enrichment are the primary program focuses.

The program offers a variety of structured classes, which include cooking, sports, art, and gardening. There are also community-based activities like bowling, shopping, and museums.

Focused on building community through planning and participating in social activities. Day support services are designed to meet the needs of adults who may not benefit from traditional vocational components.
